Sport, Amenities, Recreation in Kesgrave

2023 has been another good year in terms of the help that SPARK has continued to give in order to support local teams, organisations and those providing amenities in Kesgrave.

The grants have varied in terms of size and purpose, but the common theme is that they were made for the benefit of Kesgrave and have amounted to £123,188 in total.

Some of the recipients are as follows:

Kesgrave High School – repairs to sport hall flooring

Heath Primary School – outdoor play equipment

Kesgrave Baptist Church – sun blinds

Kesgrave Kestrels – portable dugouts

Kesgrave Cof E Charity (All Saints) – roofing repairs and re-wiring of church hall

Kesgrave Kruisers – inaugural 10k run in memory of Alan Brown

NB. Although SPARK does not generally make grants for maintenance, the High School and Church Hall grants were made to allow continued hiring to the public rather than lose them.

And of course, Kesgrave Town Council for the Fun Day, Christmas Celebrations and re-surfacing of the play area at KWMCC.

The types of projects funded have been made possible through the continued support of the 2nd Stop Charity Shop which is SPARK's primary source of income.

SPARK is willing to consider applications to assist with funding for sport, recreation and amenities in Kesgrave and hopes that 2024 provides far more opportunities for Kesgrave based teams, groups, and other organisations flourish or perhaps even start a new club, group or activity.
